OVERCOMING THE OBSTACLES OF DISCIPLESHIP


Most people feel too busy, overwhelmed or ill-equipped to make disciples.

That's why we want to share practical ways to make disciples in your everyday life, regardless of circumstances, so you can confidently impact generations for Christ.



SO, HOW DO I DISCIPLE SOMEONE?


IDENTIFY
